DISCUSSION & PRAYER ([PHILIPPIANS 4:6-7](#))

REFLECTION

1. What stands out to you from the Scriptures you just read?
2. Based on those passages, how would you explain in your own words what it means to live as a citizen of Heaven?

APPLICATION

1. People who are gone from their country for an extended time tend to long for the comforts of home. As “temporary residents and foreigners” in this world ([1 Peter 1:17](#), [1 Peter 2:11](#)), what might a citizen of Heaven long for? How can you get a taste of that while still on earth?
2. Someone who pledges allegiance to Jesus the King renounces (or repents from) what has ruled them in the past ([Mark 1:15](#)). They are given a new, overarching identity as children of God ([John 1:12](#)) and citizens of Heaven. Focusing on yourself, what aspects of your identity might compete with your identity in Christ? (For example, when I let my identity as a Parent become primary, I might make choices based on pleasing/appeasing my children, rather than honoring God.)
3. How are you preparing yourself to face the results of the upcoming presidential election as a citizen of Heaven, with faith that Jesus is King no matter what?
