

A message from Aaron Winowiski

Thousands of our neighbors have walked away from God and the Church over the last ten years. What will it take to reach into the 47,000+ disconnected people in Marathon County in order to reverse that trend?

That is the question that drives me. The answers are becoming clearer as we learn from people in places where that kind of reversal is happening-disciples are making disciple-making disciples in Spirit-fueled,





multiplying movements. It's already clear that the conventional way of "doing church" isn't going to solve the problem. God has put New Day in a unique position to be unconventional, to seek His will and experiment with different ways of being the Church on mission for Him in Marathon County and beyond.

With that in mind, New Day continued our three-fold Overflow vision in 2021: to (1) put our stake in the ground, (2) pray for multiplication, and (3) pour out blessings. While our mission, vision and values haven't changed, our methods have as we reorganize in a way that is designed to reach into the 47,000+ disconnected people in Marathon County.

I'm so glad that even as we make progress on renovating the building, God is making progress renovating us. We are investing more in prayer. We are having spiritual discussions around tables and in online chats. We have built a relationship with one of the most dynamic disciple making movements in the world (Dr. Aila Tasse and Lifeway Missions, International in Kenya).

In the upcoming fiscal year, New Day's Church Board will study, discuss and apply principles of a "starfish" church (thestarfishandthespirit.com). Unlike a spider, which is crippled when a part of it is removed, you can



remove a leg from a starfish and find a very different result. The starfish grows a new leg, and the leg grows a new starfish! That's because every part of the starfish has what it needs in order to become a whole starfish. As each of us sits with people around tables in our homes, workplaces,

schools, parks, bars and restaurants, we can do somethina than more invite people to go to church: we can be the Church going to them. Every



disciple has the Holy Spirit living in them and carries the DNA of the Church with them.

Among the 47,000+ disconnected people in Marathon County, God is preparing some to discover the Good News of Jesus, to bring Christ's love into their sphere of influence, and to be the Church where they are. My goal is to help you find those people and equip them to find and equip others. Only through that kind of multiplication will we see thousands of people becoming disciples who make disciple-makers in Marathon County and beyond.

Backyard Missions 2021:

As a refresher, the objective of Backyard Missions is – to reach out into the local community to spread the gospel and to love our neighbor through project work and establishing relationships.

In 2021 the number of volunteers increased from the previous year to 33. Praise God for the 33 individuals that chose to say yes to God's calling to serve him and share Jesus in our community!



Due to the pandemic, it was still not a norma for Backvard vear Because of Missions. that, we had to find new and creative ways to reach out to the community as a whole. Our approach was to reach out to former families that we had served in the past. Some of them had additional project work for us and others had suggestions



of new families to bless during our outreach. We had a total of nine projects that included two new families, six returning families and a Blood Drive held at the Ministry Center during Backyard Missions week. Over 630 volunteer hours were served for the week!

One thing that has remained constant every year is God showing up in the midst of our week with a display of his power and love.

The format for the 2022 outreach is similar to 2021, where we reach out to former families and extensions



of their families. However, we have also reinstituted the nomination forms for any family to fill out anonymously for a need they see in the Wausau/ Schofield/Rothschild/Kronenwetter community.

We have a balance of \$2,422.21 from 2021 to use for funding the 2022 mission.
